Hi Mark,

I heard back from the Office of Rail on the Townships questions. Please see response below:

1. MDOT will keep the standard 5 year term for the two agreements, one for the sewer line and one for the water line. This has been our standard practice and is working well with all other utilities across the state. We will not make an exception here.
2. MDOT is willing to move forward with a new agreement and forgive the \$10,000 payment.

Additionally, MDOT still needs the permit (after the fact) for the most recent installation.

This is also a notice to the Township, you cannot assume you can freely use MDOT property. In the future, please reach out to the Office of Rail and get permission through the proper process to use MDOT property before a project commences.
